Fossey, the first thing is that we feel that you have behaved yourself pretty well in the past four months and so we are going to agree that the probation order should continue, so we want you to carry on what you're doing now, keeping out of trouble, and that will continue, and therefore we're going to fine you. We take into account what happened in the case of Bell so we're going to reduce the fine by a small amount - we're going to make it £400 instead of £500. Right. Now, the next thing is, how is it going to be paid? First of all, there is bail in the sum of £100 ... it's not his money? Yes, I thought that. All right. When are you next expecting to get paid? You've just been paid, then? You say you get paid every two weeks but have you just been paid? When is your insurance premium due? Three weeks from now. Well now, you may want to consult with your counsel about this but what we propose is that the £400 will be paid off at the rate of £50 every three weeks, starting ... the first payment to be made in three weeks' time. Now, that's what we're suggesting; you may want to consult with your advocate to see whether ... that will be fine? Okay, all right, but anyway, we're giving you ... what we're saying to you is you must pay it at the rate of £50 every three weeks, starting in three weeks' time from today. Now, the way you pay it ... I don't know if you ever visit Jersey but you will . what ... send the money order to the Viscount's Department? Your advocate will tell you how to do that but what you must do is to send ... if you don't come to Jersey, send the money by money order.

ADVOCATE: He can make arrangements with his bank, Sir. BAILIFF: That's right, that's an even better way, tell the bank to pay £50 to the Viscount and your advocate will tell you how to do that in Jersey. Right? Now, let's be quite clear about this - £50 every three weeks starting three weeks from today. Now, you know that if, in fact, you fail to pay £50 every three weeks, you can be arrested and put in prison in Jersey if you set foot in this Island. Right? Yes, in default; I'm saying if you fail

to pay in the way we've said. you understand that, don't you? That's right. Now, the default will be six months' imprisonment so it's £400 or six months and if you fail, then the amount of prison that you serve will be in proportion to the amount which is still outstanding; in other words, if you don't pay any at all, you'll serve the full six months subject, of course, to remission. Is that quite clear? So it's £400 fine or six months' imprisonment and you pay at the rate of £50 every three weeks starting in three weeks' time.
