DEPUTY BAILIFF: In the Jersey case of "Makarios", the Court said that in the case of a grave offence the Court did not have to be guided by the test of whether or not the accused would respond to his bail. This is a grave offence. Even on the authority that Mr. Slater handed up, a further paragraph of which he did not read, states: "it is not usual to grant bail where the prisoner has a bad criminal record". This man has a bad criminal record. He has pleaded guilty to a very serious offence. The Court has no hesitation whatsoever in refusing the application.
