A.G. -v- William McCallum

<u>THE BAILIFF</u>: We think for all the reasons you have advanced Mr Sinel that we are going to allow this appeal. This is a young man of good character, no background report was obtained and we are not going to avail ourselves of the offer of Miss Nicolle, we think we should deal with it now. Having regard to the previous case you notified us about, Keogh, we think that a fine would be right, but this is a slightly more serious offence than Keogh's. This was late at night, three young woman were affected, and in spite of what you said it should be a reasonable fine. We are going to fine your client fifty pounds, or in default seven days. Is this a legal aid - legal aid costs.
