**JUDGMENT**

THE BAILIFF: As the Attorney General has said robbery of this nature is a very serious offence and particularly in a case where it causes great distress to innocent people. We agree that what the young lady went through is a terrifying experience with a knife and one can be thankful that nothing worse occurred.

Having regard to all the circumstances, Mr Renouf, in spite of what you have said and you have said it very fully, we do not feel able to reduce the conclusions and we think the Attorney General has taken into account quite properly the previous cases and the sentences imposed and we therefore

sentence you to the conclusions asked for by the Attorney General that is to say, count 1 twenty seven months, and count 2 three months consecutive, a total of thirty months and we hope that you will eventually, when you come out of prison, amend your ways because we think you can do so.
