## JUDG MENT

BAILIFF: Mr Meiklejohn, you have said all you can on behalf of your client. We note what you say as regards the case of Hughes, but your client had hardly come out of prison when he started offending again, which is an aggravating factor. He has totally misused such opportunity as the Island can give him. We cannot find such mitigating factors as would entitle us to reduce the conclusions. They are accordingly granted and, Wibberley, you are sentenced to a total of two years.
