JUDG MENT

THE BAILIFF: This is an offence which, of course, has to carry with it a custodial sentence and Advocate Dart has very properly not sought to persuade us to the contrary. However, in view of the fact that he is a first offender and taking into account his background, his expression of remorse and eventual co-operation and his guilty plea, we think that we can make a little more allowance for these factors than the Crown has in arriving at the proper sentence. You are therefore sentenced to eight months' imprisonment instead of nine.
