JUDG MENT

COMMISSIONER LE CRAS: Moffat, the Court notes that by all accounts you are a hard worker and that you prefer to be usefully employed. It is reported that you have a pleasing personality and indeed are capable of hard work. We note the Probation Officer's comment that your ambition is to find a good

job and to settle down in Jersey. We note also your satisfactory attendance at the alcohol study group. However, we have to say that orders are there to be obeyed. It is clear that your compliance with the Probation Order has been near to blatant abuse and your subsequent conviction is a clear breach of the Order. In those circumstances we have no hesitation in accepting the submission of the Attorney General and you will go to prison for six months on each count to be served concurrently.
