JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: You have, as the Attorney General has said, been given,
in effect, two chances by this Court before. Everything that has
been done has been with an aim to try and help you to learn to live

without offending in this way. You do not appear to understand that you cannot go on stealing from people in the way you have and particularly against people in almost similar circumstances as you who are having to live in the Shelter at night. It is a very despicable thing to do to steal from your fellow lodger at the Shelter. A lot of people who live there are people down on their luck as we know and for their savings to be taken in that way, we think, reflects very badly on you and we cannot but grant the conclusions of the Attorney General. We see no reason to reduce them or make them concurrent as opposed to consecutive and therefore the conclusions are granted and you are sentenced on the indictments as follows: today's indictment to three months' imprisonment; the 1988 indictment: count 1 six months' imprisonment; and on each of counts 2 to 56 ; six months' concurrent with each other, but consecutive to today's indictment, making a total of nine months' imprisonment.
