Review of Probation Order imposed on 16th November, 1991, in respect of breaking and entering with intent (Count 1); possession of controlled drug (Counts 2, 3, and 4); supplying controlled drug (Counts 5 and 6).

## JUDGMENT

BAILIFF: Falle, you have been given every chance, all of which you have thrown away. You really have to learn that if you are given these chances and throw them away, you have to accept what happens after that. People who have drugs of the type and amount you had, particularly LSD, and share it with friends, run a

great risk of going to prison and that risk has now materialised. The Crown has asked for a total of five months. One month for your larceny and four months for the other offences and we cannot think that that amount is wrong.

You are therefore sentenced to one month on Count one and to four months on each of Counts two to six, concurrently with each other but consecutive to Count one, making a total of five months. The drugs are to be forfeited and destroyed and the Probation Order is discharged.
