PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS:

Two - driving.

CONCLUSIONS:

6 months' imprisonment.

SENTENCE AND OBSERVATIONS OF THE COURT:

120 hours' Community Service. 1 year's probation.

JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: There is no doubt but that without the key, these premises would not have been broken into. However, the Court has taken account of the matters fully and fairly put before it by the prosecution as well as by the defence and under the circumstances we have come to the conclusion that you, Cooke, will be sentenced to one year's probation with 120 hours' Community Service.
