## JUDGMENT

THE LIEUTENANT BAILIFF: This is a case where we should exercise our discretion to grant an adjournment under Article 6 of the Bankruptcy (Désastre) (Jersey) Law, 1990. Two of the three grounds identified by the learned Deputy Bailiff in his Judgment of 30th March, 1995, at p.10 clearly come into play viz. at line 43:

- "(2) We could grant an adjournment if the debtor could show to our satisfaction that the debt could be paid in full.
- (3) We could grant an adjournment on a matter of dispute to allow evidence to be called so that the Court had the fullest picture before it".

Sufficient has been put before us to show that there is a possibility that Mr. Shelton's debts may be paid in full. There is a dispute which can only be resolved by hearing evidence. The adjournment should be a short one. We are not, however, in a position to decide when this should come on again.

In these circumstances we formally adjourn this hearing to the Samedi Court, on Friday, 22nd September, 1995. In the meantime counsel must apply for a date so that they may advise the Court of the position on that day.
