Counts (1) & (2)

Hesketh set fire to his bed at St. Saviour's Hospital where he resides under a Guardianship Order. Gave various reasons, e.g. stress,

frustration, a voice telling to do it etc.

Count (3)

1

Went absent without leave and drank 10 cans of cider. Attacked and kicked an acquaintance who had been drinking and was asleep in Parade Gardens. Bad attack.

DETAILS OF MITIGATION:

Mental condition and history of psychiatric problems.

PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS:

Record dating from 1982 including malicious damage, larceny, arson, assault, breach of the peace, alcohol related offences, etc.

CONCLUSIONS:

Count 1: Binding over Order to be of good behaviour for 3 years.

Count 2: Binding over Order to be of good behaviour for 3 years, concurrent. Count 3: binding over Order to be of good behaviour for 3 years, concurrent.

SENTENCE AND OBSERVATIONS

OF THE COURT:

Difficult case. Highlights lack of proper secure accommodation for mentally disordered offenders. With hesitation, conclusions granted.
