During a search of the Defendant's home 3 lumps of Cannabis Resin seized. Defendant admitted that they were his. Personal use.

DETAILS OF MITIGATION:

Plea of Guilty from outset. Defendant had already spent 7 weeks in custody on remand.

PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS:

Long record including conviction for importing controlled drugs for which on 26th March, 1992 Defendant sentenced to 3 years imprisonment.

CONCLUSIONS:

6 weeks imprisonment.

SENTENCE AND OBSERVATIONS OF THE COURT:

Conclusions Granted.
