Application for a review of the Magistrate's decision of 24th December, 1996, to grant bail 24 hours before the applicant left the Island for medical treatment in England.

On 8th October, 1996,

the applicant pleaded not guilty to 1 count of supplying a controlled drug (cannabis resin), contrary to Article 5(b) of the Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law, 1978, and was remanded in custody without a bail option.

On 5th November, 1996,

the applicant was charged, with others, to 1 count of being knowingly concerned in the fraudulent evasion of the prohibition on the importation of a controlled drug (cannabis resin), contrary to Article 77(b) of the Customs and Excise (General Provisions) (Jersey) Law, 1972, to which a not guilty plea was entered and the applicant was remanded in custody without a ball option.

Application granted : bail granted with effect from today, on conditions.

JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: It is important to restate that this is an application to review the discretion of the Magistrate. As the Attorney General has correctly said, this would in ordinary circumstances be a hopeless application.

The learned Magistrate granted conditional bail on the basis that the bail would be restricted to allowing the applicant to travel to England for treatment at Southampton Hospital. This Court, having heard counsel for the applicant, and as an act of mercy, is prepared to modify that decision of the Magistrate so as to enable the applicant to travel to England this afternoon. Bail is therefore granted but it is conditional on a number of matters. First, the applicant should surrender his passport, if he has one. Secondly, he should live at his home address in Hastings; that address to be furnished to the police before he leaves the jurisdiction. Thirdly, he should report to the local police station at Hastings twice weekly, except of course whilst he is undergoing treatment at Southampton Hospital and obviously the residence condition is subject to that exception as well. The applicant is to surrender to bail within four days of completing his treatment at Southampton Hospital and must then return to the Island.
