Plea: Facts admitted.

Details of Offence:

Allowed occupation of "Penthouse C", La Colline Court, Gorey to be occupied by Mr. P.R. Fearn and his wife when Mr. Fearn's "J" category employment term had expired and without the consent of the Committee.

Details of Mitigation:

Management changes had meant that matters had been allowed to become disorganised. If application had been made Committee would likely have granted consent.

Previous Convictions: None.

Conclusions: £1,250 fine; £250 costs.

Sentence and Observations of the Court:

Conclusions granted. Accepted that the offence was at the lower end of the range.
