Admitted breach of a probation order, made by the Royal Court on 11th October, 1996, [*see Jersey Unreported Judgment of that date*] when the accused appeared with three co-defendants: Emidio Marco Rios, José Manuel Teixeira de Freitas, and Ricardo Filipe Nunes Vasconcelos. On 11th October, 1996, the Court placed the accused on one year's probation with 120 hours' community service, following a guilty plea to:

- 4 counts of aiding, assisting or participating in breaking and entering and larceny (counts 7A, 10A, 38A, 39A).
- 4 counts of receiving stolen property (counts 40, 41, 42, 43).
- 1 count of possession of a controlled drug, contrary to Article 6(1) of the Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law, 1978 (count 44; cannabis resin).

The Court reimposed Probation Order with Community Service, as before.

JUDGMENT

5 THE DEPUTY BAILIFF: We are going to reimpose the Community Service Order by allowing it to stand. If you live in this Island you must obey its laws. You must also be careful as to how you choose your friends. Community Service may be difficult but it is much better than going to prison. If you cannot attend you must inform

Mr. Jordan or Mr. da Silva or one of his colleagues. We do not want to see you in this Court again.
