The Department of Finance and Personnel makes the following Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 3(4) and (7) of the Superannuation (Northern Ireland) Order $1972(\mathbf{a})$ and now vested in it(**b**).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Superannuation (Commission for Victims and Survivors for Northern Ireland) Order (Northern Ireland) 2012, shall come into operation on 17th December 2012 and shall have effect from 23rd May 2008.

Addition to list of offices

2. There shall be added to the offices listed in Schedule 1 to the Superannuation (Northern Ireland) Order 1972, the office of member of the Commission for Victims and Survivors for Northern Ireland (c).
