of his debts and damages, for which he shall have ready execution against the ' injurer,' b. 1. tit. 9. § 29. To which the fulpender opposed a paffage of Mr Erskine, who, speaking of an arrestee acting in contempts of the diligence, fays, ' He may be condemned to pay the whole debt a second time to the arrefter.' by which the debt originally due by himfelf appears to be meant, b. 3. tit. 6. \$14.

THE LORD ORDINARY at first pronounced this interlocator : ' Finds, That by the law of Scotland, a perfon who commits breach of arreftment, does thereby fubject himfelf in payment of the whole debt contained in the decree or horning on which the arreftment was used, although the value of the fubject arrefted be much lefs; and that the law, as to this particular, is not more fevere, or lefs rear fonably fo, than in cafes of elcape from prifon.' But his Lordship afterwards THE MARKET took the caufe to report on informations.

The Court were clearly of opinion, That by a just interpretation of the statute. the contravener could be liable no farther than in valorem; and it was observed. that not only Lord Stair, but all the writers, not excepting Mr Erskine, had expreffed themfelves fomewhat inaccurately on this fubject.

It was farther obferved, that there was an obvious diffinction between a cafe of this kind, and that of efcape from prifon; for in the one the amount of the lofs refulting to the creditor may be eafily known; but with regard to the other, it might be impossible to tell what exertions in the debtor squalor carceris could produce.

THE LGRDS found, That no action lay on the flatute ultra valorem.
