FOUND that the cedent could not fwear in prejudice of the affignce, albeit the charge was raifed by the cedent, and that the affignee only compeared in the suspension for his interest.

1623. November 19. Mr John Ross against The LAIRD of BALMHRRINOCH.

THE LORDS found that the taking of affignation from a third party, did not prejudge the affignee of his own right quhilk he had otherways.

## 1625. February 2. A. against B.

Assignation with intimation (*nominis*) or the pofferfion of a right, ceffible by fimple affignation, as if a liferent furtained against a posterior comprising, or arrestment; notwithstanding of this reply, that it was offered to be proven, that the cedent remained in possession.

1626. July 27. L. ANSTRUTHER against BLACK.

In an action betwixt the L. of Anftruther, as affignee conflicted by Sir Thomas Difchington, to fome monies addebted to him by Mr Black, out of the lands of Largo, the LORDS found, That an affignation made to fums of money, for the which Sir Thomas, the cedent, had charter and fafine, the time of the affignation, could not be fo valiably affigned; but that notwithflanding of the affignation and intimation thereof, another of the cedent's creditors might thereafter comprife the fame from the debtor; and which comprifer would be preferred in his right to the prior affignee, feeing the affignation was not *bubilis modus* to

No 13, A perion, alfigning a fum, for which he has heritable fecurity, is not thereby denuded. The right may be, notwithflanding, adjudged.
