1724. July 15. Col. L. Munro against Touch of Logierieth.

NULLITIES repelled,—1. That summons did not appear to be called by the clerk before enrolment. 2. That no conclusion against superiors, though named in the against of the decreet. Ergo horning and charge unwarrantable.

1735. November 14. HAIRE against THOMSON.

OBJECTION repelled,—That the adjudger had got payment of a part of his principal sum by possessing the tenement on his heritable bond; in respect it appeared, that the sums uplifted by him over his annual-rents before his adjudication, did not exceed the expense of his infeftments.

1735. November 14. Trustees of Mr. Jo. Montgomery's Creditors against Lord Hope.

TRUSTEES allowed to adjudge lands disponed to Lord Hope by his uncle Marquis Anandale; although lands taken up [by] the Marquis, the male heir, might be sufficient for the debt: reserving contra executionem. Are under discussion.

1736. February 18. ELIZABETH REID against HENRY of AUCHINLOICH.

OBJECTION to an adjudication against three heirs portioners, that one of them was not charged in special, restricts it to a security for principal and annual-rents, though the shares of the other two were sufficient to pay the debt.

1737. July. Creditors of Newlaw against Mollence.

OBJECTION,—That no proof of passive titles was brought against a minor, allowed to be supplied by yet proving passive titles. 2. Adjudication, led thirty-three years ago, does not bear that minors tutors were cited in special charge,
