# **ROAD TRAFFIC**

# The A9 Trunk Road (Kincraig to Dalraddy Dualling) (Temporary 40mph Speed Restriction) Order 2015

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1), 14(1)(a) and (4) and 15(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act  $1984(\mathbf{a})$  and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near that length of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

In accordance with section 14(1A) of that Act, they have consulted with the affected National Park(**b**).

In accordance with section 15(2) of that Act, they are satisfied that the execution of the works will take longer than eighteen months and they will revoke this Order as soon as the works are completed.

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A9 Trunk Road (Kincraig to Dalraddy Dualling) (Temporary 40mph Speed Restriction) Order 2015, and comes into force on 14th August 2015.

#### Speed restriction

**2.** No person may drive any vehicle on the length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, specified in the Schedule at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour when such a restriction is

identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

#### Exemptions

**3.** No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to vehicles being used for carrying out the works or vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes.

**4.** No speed restriction imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations  $2011(\mathbf{a})$  when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.

### **SCHEDULE**

## Specified Length of Road

That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road being the northbound and southbound carriageways from the at grade private access road junction leading to the B9152 and the property known as East Lodge by Croftcarnoch to a point 2.7 kilometres or thereby southwest of the Aviemore (South) Junction of the A9 Trunk Road with the B9152, a distance of 9.5 kilometres or thereby.
