#### **NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL**

- 1. The Appellant is a citizen of Jamaica born 14<sup>th</sup> January 1982 who was granted permission to appeal to the Upper Tribunal against a determination of Judge of the First-tier Tribunal Walters, dismissing the Appellant's appeal against the Respondent's refusal to issue her with a permanent residence card as the spouse of an EEA national.
- 2. The appeal was listed before me on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2014. The Appellant did not attend but had submitted a letter dated 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2014 indicating
