DETERMINATION AND REASONS

This appellant was granted permission to appeal the decision of the Firsttier Tribunal as follows:

While the 'new Rules' (in force from 9 July 2012) do provide (at 276B, not A) a route to indefinite leave to remain for people who, like the (main) appellant have been here lawfully for ten years or more, that needed to be considered in terms of <u>MF (Nigeria) [2013] EWCA Civ 1192</u>. Unless there is an objection within the time set out in the attached letter, there will be a fresh hearing before the First-tier Tribunal on that basis.

That decision was sent to the parties on 9 January, with copies of a notice requiring a response within 14 days. There has been none.
