## **NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL AND**

#### **REASONS FOR THE TRIBUNAL GIVING CONSENT**

- 1. The appellant is a citizen of Pakistan who appealed to the First-tier Tribunal against the decision of the Secretary of State of 28 December 2013. The First-tier Tribunal dismissed the appeal in a determination promulgated on 11 July 2014.
- 2. By way of an email to the Upper Tribunal dated 20 April 2015 the appellant through states that she wishes her appeal to be withdrawn.
- 3. Consent of the Upper Tribunal is required for a party to withdraw its case. Having carefully considered the facts of this appeal as a whole, and observing that the Secretary of State was the successful party before the First-tier Tribunal, I give such consent to the appellant to withdraw his case.
