NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL AND REASONS FOR THE TRIBUNAL GIVING CONSENT

- 1. For ease of comprehension, the parties are referred to by their status on appeal before the First-tier Tribunal. By way of a letter dated 28 September 2015, the Respondent has requested that her case be treated as withdrawn by the Upper Tribunal.
- 2. This request was confirmed to me by oral submissions from Ms S Sreeraman, a Senior Presenting Officer, who confirmed that the withdrawal was confirmed by a Mr McGirr, a senior member of the Specialist Appeals Team.
- 3. Consent of the Upper Tribunal is required for a party to withdraw its case. Having carefully considered the facts of this appeal as a whole, and observing that the Appellant was the successful party before the First-tier Tribunal, I give such consent for the case to be withdrawn.
