DECISION AND REASONS

- 1. The appellant was born on 15th August 1974 and is a Libyan citizen.
- 2. On 3rd July, 2015 the respondent refused to grant the appellant leave to remain in the United Kingdom and the appellant appealed to the First-tier Tribunal. His appeal was heard by First-tier Tribunal Judge Howard on 2nd September 2016. The appellant, dissatisfied with the

judge's decision to refuse to allow his appeal, sought and obtained permission to challenge it.

- 3. The matter was called for hearing before me today when, on behalf of the Secretary of State, Mr Mills invited me to allow the appeal outright, given the errors in the determination, which were accepted. This determination appears as a matter of record only.
- 4. The appellant's appeal is allowed under the immigration rules.
