DECISION AND REASONS

- 1. On 12 July 2018 a Notice and Directions was issued to the parties in the following terms:
 - "1. The appellant seeks permission to challenge the decision of First-tier Tribunal Judge Siddiqi dismissing his appeal against the respondent's decision of 19 December 2017. Permission was refused in the First-tier Tribunal on 11 May 2018 and the appellant seeks to renew his application in the Upper Tribunal.
 - 2. It seems to me, however, that there was no valid appeal before Judge Siddiqi, given that the decision of 19 December 2017 was a refusal to treat submissions as a fresh claim under paragraph 353 of the immigration rules which is not an appealable decision.
 - 3. In the circumstances the Tribunal is minded to grant permission, set aside the decision of the First-tier Tribunal and re-make the decision by dismissing the appeal for lack of jurisdiction.

- 3. In the circumstances, and given the terms of the directions issued to the parties, I assume that neither party has any objection to the course of action I proposed.
- 4. Accordingly, I grant permission to appeal to the Upper Tribunal, I set aside the decision of Judge Siddiqi for reason of error of law and I re-make the decision in the appeal by dismissing it for lack of jurisdiction.
