### **DECISION AND REASONS**

1. The appellant is a citizen of Pakistan born on 25<sup>th</sup> December, 1992. He applied for entry clearance to join his partner in the United Kingdom under Appendix FM. The respondent refused that application on 21<sup>st</sup> December, 2016 and the appellant appealed that decision to the First-tier Tribunal which heard it at Birmingham on 1<sup>st</sup> December, 2017.
