# **CONSENT ORDER**

**Background** 

- 1. The appellant is appealing against a decision of Judge of the Firsttier Tribunal Colvin ("the judge") promulgated on 14 April 2021.
- 2. The judge allowed the appeal on human rights and humanitarian protection grounds but not on asylum grounds.

- 3. In a rule 24 response dated 27 July 2021 the respondent accepted that the appeal should have been allowed on asylum grounds.
- 4. At the hearing, the parties agreed to the proceedings being disposed of by a consent order.

<u>Decision</u>

- 5. Pursuant to Rule 39 of the Tribunal Procedure (Upper Tribunal) Rules 2008 and by the consent of the parties I make the following order:
- 6. The decision of the First-tier Tribunal to allow the appellant's appeal on humanitarian and human rights grounds stands.
- 7. The decision of the First-tier Tribunal to dismiss the appellant's asylum appeal is set aside and remade by allowing the appeal on asylum grounds.
