## **JUDGMENT**

The unanimous judgment of the Employment Tribunal is that:

- 1. The claimant was unfairly dismissed.
- 2. The complaint of pregnancy discrimination under section 18 Equality Act 2010 succeeds.
- 3. The respondent is ordered to pay the claimant the sum of £5,000 in respect of injury to feelings, and £1,603 in respect of compensation for loss of earnings.
- 4. The respondent is ordered to pay the claimant the total sum of £6,603.

## THE EMPLOYMENT TRIBUNALS (INTEREST) ORDER 1990

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties. That day is known as "the relevant decision day". The date from which interest starts to accrue is called "the calculation day" and is the day immediately following the relevant decision day.
