JUDGMENT

- 1. The Respondent's name is amended to Silicon Finance Limited.
- 2. The complaint that the Claimant was unfairly dismissed is struck out.
- 3. The claim for a statutory redundancy payment is struck out.
- 4. The claim of unauthorised deduction from wages succeeds and the Respondent is ordered to pay the Claimant £193.08 in respect of that deduction.
- 5. The claim for damages for failure to give notice of termination of employment succeeds and the Respondent is ordered to pay the Claimant £2,916.17.

REASONS

- 1. The Claimant complains of unfair dismissal and claims a statutory redundancy payment.
- 2. Sections 108 and 155 of the Employment Rights Act 1996 require a Claimant to have not less than two years' service to make those claims.
- 3. The Claimant has not established that he was employed by the Respondent for two years or more.
- 4. The Claimant has failed to give any reason, despite being given the opportunity to do so, why those claims should not be struck out.
- 5. Accordingly, those claims are struck out.
- 6. The Respondent has not entered a response to the Claimant's complaints of unauthorised deduction from wages and claim for damages for failure to pay notice pay. He is therefore entitled to a Judgment in his favour in respect of those complaints, under Rule 21 of the Tribunal's Rules of Procedure.
