JUDGMENT

The judgment of the Tribunal is as follows:

- 1. The Tribunal declares that the claimant's complaint under section 23 of the Employment Rights Act 1996, together with her complaint that the respondent failed to pay her accrued holiday pay on the termination of her working relationship with the respondent, are well-founded. The respondent is ordered to pay to the claimant the net sum of £608 for wages unpaid and £27 for holiday pay unpaid.
- 2. The total net sum of £635 shall therefore be paid to the claimant by the respondent forthwith.

Name of case: Miss P Jarvis-Dean v Delph Worsley Limited

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties.
