## JUDGMENT

The claims are struck out because they have no reasonable prospect of success.

## REASONS

- At a public preliminary hearing which took place today on 2 February 2022, the claimant confirmed that she wished to bring three claims. The first was a claim for unlawful deduction of wages, two other claims are brought under the Equality Act.
- 2. The claimant confirmed that the outstanding wages that she was seeking had been paid to her on 30 July 2021. I therefore determined that the claim should be struck out as there was no prospect of it succeeding on a legal basis, there was no outstanding money.
- 3. The claimant had not only failed to make any reference to protected characteristics in her claim form, in answer to the Employment Tribunal order of 21 December 2021 she had stated that she was not relying on any protected characteristics. Her claims under the Equality Act have no basis in law and cannot therefore succeed.
- 4. For these reasons I have struck out all of the claims.
