JUDGMENT

- 1. The Claimant was unfairly dismissed.
- 2. Applying the principle in <u>Polkey v A E Dayton Services Limited [1987] IRLR 503</u> there was a 100% chance of the Claimant being dismissed fairly in any event. The compensatory award is, therefore, reduced by 100%.
- 3. It is just and equitable to reduce the Claimant's:
 - a. basic award to nil pursuant to s.122(2) Employment Rights Act 1996: and
 - b. compensatory award to nil pursuant to s.123(6) Employment Rights Act 1996.
