ANNEX A

Statement of reasons for consent order

- 1. This appeal concerned the Respondent's Decision Notice FER50395418. That Notice sets out the terms of the original information request at paragraph 5.
- 2. In its review of 1 February 2011, the Appellant confirmed its decision to withhold the information from disclosure under section 43(2) of the Act. During the Commissioner's investigation, the Appellant subsequently accepted that the information was environmental information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 and confirmed that it was withholding information requested under Regulations 12(4)(d), 12(5)(e), and 12(5)(f).
- 3. In the said Decision Notice, the Respondent decided that the Appellant incorrectly applied the exceptions relied upon and required the Appellant to disclose the withheld information.
- 4. The Appellant appealed against the Decision Notice.
- 5. Whilst the Appellant maintains that it was correct to rely upon the exceptions, the Appellant does not wish to continue with its appeal as the Appellant will be closed by 31 March 2012, following the Government's decision to abolish Regional Development Agencies. Accordingly, it will not be in a position to take part in a final hearing which the Tribunal has confirmed will be after this date.
- 6. In view of all the circumstances and subject to the Tribunal's views, the parties jointly submit that it is appropriate for these proceedings to be concluded by way of consent order, and that it is appropriate for the Tribunal to consider their joint application without holding a hearing (as envisaged by rule 37(2)).
- 7. The documents listed in section 2 will be provided in hard copy form.
