DECISION

Background

- 1. The Applicant seeks a determination under Schedule 11 to the Commonhold and Leasehold Reform Act 2002 as to whether an administration charge of £50 plus VAT is payable in respect of grant of permission for a lessee to keep a pet in the leasehold property.
- 2. The Respondent says there is no authority under the lease to make such a charge.
- 3. The Tribunal considered this to be straightforward matter which could be determined at a telephone hearing on 18 August 2017.
- 4. The Tribunal directed the parties to exchange position statements by 11 August 2017 with two copies on the Tribunal.
- 5. The Respondent did not provide the Tribunal with a position statement.
- 6. Mr Paul Taylor of Remus attended the hearing for the Applicant. Ms Katerina Birkeland and Mr Alex Costello attended for the Respondent.

Decision

- 7. The Respondent accepts that it is liable to pay an administration fee of £50 plus VAT to the Applicant for giving written permission for a leaseholder to keep a dog in an apartment on the Grand Ocean View Estate.
- 8. The Tribunal makes an order to give effect to the Respondent's admission.
- 9. The Tribunal Orders the Respondent to reimburse the Applicant with the Application fee of £100 within 2 months from date of the decision.
- 10. The Tribunal records that the permission will be given in the form of a pet licence. The pet licence will include the following matters which were agreed by the parties at the hearing:

Revocation of a Pet Licence

- The Applicant will consult with the Respondent's property manager before any decision is made regarding revocation of the licence.
- The Applicant will give a leaseholder reasonable time to remedy the contravention of the licence before any decision is made regarding revocation.

• The complaint giving rise to revocation must be substantiated and based on justifiable grounds.

Walking the Dog

- Whenever possible leaseholders should walk their dogs outside the Estate.
- When leaseholders walk their dogs in the Estate, the dogs should at all times be on a leash and the walking confined to the established footpaths.
- Whenever a dog fouls within the Estate, the leaseholders should take reasonable steps to ensure that the all the excreta are removed from the Estate.

Microchips

• The Applicant shall allow a reasonable period of time for the leaseholders to have microchips inserted in their dogs.
