Their Lordships do not think it necessary to state the nature of the case, or the arguments which were used in the Court below upon it. It is sufficient for them to say that Mr. De Gruyther, who has argued the case with very great fairness, and has placed before their Lordships everything that would be material for a judgment in the Appellant's favour, has failed to show their Lordships any reason why the judgment of the Court below should be reversed.

Under these circumstances their Lordships will humbly advise His Majesty that the appeal be dismissed, and the Appellant must pay the costs of it.
