We are instructed to advise you that the Directors feel that they have now given you ample time to conclude satisfactory arrangements for the working of the above Lot which you are unable to work in accordance with the terms of Sublease No.66/37.

More than five months ago they gave their
approval to the area being let under haptong arrangements to Towkay Foong Seong, and they have waited
patiently while your sublessee negotiated for the
maximum rate of tribute he could obtain from
Towkay Foong Seong, although this rate did not
affect the tribute of 7% payable to the Company.
We understand that the sub-sublessee has now
agreed a rate of tribute with Towkay Foong Seong
but has now sought to impose a further condition
of a substantial deposit.

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 10th instant.

It is a fact that I agreed to grant as one of the terms of a new comprehensive agreement a huptong to Foong Seong over a small area of the mining rights of the Khong Heng Kongsi held under subsisting sub-leases and written agreements.

Such a huptong can only be granted upon the terms settled by the Khong Heng Kongsi and will only be granted after execution of the comprehensive new agreement a copy of which I sent you.

In other words the execution of a new agreement covering the whole of the original areas is a condition precedent to the grant by the Kongsi of any sub-rights or of the surrender of any of its own rights.

The Khong Heng Kongsi cannot and will not allow you to state terms and conditions of any sub-rights to be granted by the Kongsi and cannot allow you to interfere with any negotiations to that end.

My negotiations so far with Foong Seong are purely negotiations and nothing more.

I wish to emphasis now that those negotiations will remain negotiations and nothing more until the new comprehensive agreement has been signed by all parties to it.

Subsequent to receipt of a letter from above with information that they had laid before the Loans Board Solicitor "the proposed variations from the working rights held by the Khong Heng Kongsi" the Secretaries of the Pegang Prospecting Co. Ltd., of which the writer is a Director, have requested us to explain to you the Company's position and action.

- 2. The Pegang Prospecting Co. wish to protect their Sub-Lessees (Estate of Ho Kok Yew) in every way, and do not wish to prejudice mining operations or restrict the area or reserves which the mine is able to work effectively.
- 30 3. The Estate of Ho Kok Yew held subleases over the whole of the Company's property in the vicinity of the mine and has done so for the past 20 years. At a meeting of all interested parties it was agreed that it was not possible for the above to work certain areas within the forseeable future and that the land had been lying idle at the expense of the Company since the Sublease was granted 20 years ago. The Company wished to have the land mined as early as possible and it was mutually agreed that the northern slopes from

the crest of the hill comprised in the northern portion of M.L. 8899 which was of no use to the above should be deleted from the Sublease, in return for which the Company would pay the Estate 2% tribute on all ore won from the land deleted. A plan attached shews the area coloured red.

4. <u>M.L. 11544 Lot 29651</u>

This lot is an isolated block south of the main road and accommodates the Sungei Johan. The Estates cannot mine this land and in view of this they agreed to Sublease to Foong Seong's Mine, immediately adjoining on the southern boundary at a tribute of 15%. The Company receive 7% and the two sublessees 4% each.

- 5. It is likely that the areas mentioned above were embodied as reserves in the loan application from the Estate. It is not possible to incorporate them in the operations of the mine either now or in the future so that their deletion from the "reserve" does not affect the mine adversely. On the contrary both the Estate, the Company will benefit from the arrangements made to get the land worked.
- 6. As stated above the Company does not wish to prejudice the Estate or mine in any way, but to do all they can to assist the mine.

We trust the disposal of the land as described above will not affect the loan approved to the mine and will not meet with opposition from the Board.



Estate of Ho Kok Yew Khong Heng Kongsi (Mine No.5)

With reference to your No. 103 in CTLC/P/328, we fear there is some misunderstanding in this matter. The representative of the Estate appreciated long ago that there was no question of Pegang Prospecting Co., Ltd. entering into any fresh agreement due to the fact that the present agreement contains dumping facilities for the mine which for certain reasons it would be almost impossible to replace. It was mutually agreed many months ago that any additional agreement was not necessary.

- 2. We were informed to-day by the representative of the Estate, Mr. Tong Sam Poy, that the delay was due to the Board, or the Solicitors of the Board as we were told, requiring an assurance that the abandoned railway reserve adjoining the mine and applied for by Pegang Prospecting would be subleased to the mine as soon as a mining title was received as a quid pro quo for the subletting of M.L. 11544.
- 3. We attach hereto a letter from the Secretaries, Pegang Prospecting Co. Ltd. giving the assurance requested.
- 4. It is to the advantage of all parties concerned that M.L. 11544 should be mined as early as possible. The Foong Seong Mine to

which it is proposed to sublease this land, as stated in our letter to the Technical Adviser dated 31st March, 1949, will soon have worked beyond the land and the opportunity to have it mined immediately will be lost. This lease is an isolated block cut off from the above mine by the main road and accommodates the S. Johan which have to be deviated at considerable expense. The Estate could not mine this land even were it to continue on their reserve of lands and it will help no one if we are prevented from getting it worked now.

5. In view of the above may we or the Estate be giving the Board's approval to Sublease M.L. 11544 to Mr. Foong Seong. We shall be obliged if this matter may receive early consideration. The writer is prepared to appear before the Board at any time if so required.







The Secretaries having read the Report of the Auditors the Chairman addressed the Meeting as follows:-

"Gentlemen:

You have had for the prescribed period the Directors' Report which was circulated with the Accounts with your permission I will take them as read: should any question arise concerning the Accounts I will endeavour to reply later.

The Accounts for the past year show a profit of \$7,660.46 and your Directors recommend the payment of a Final Dividend of 10% less Income Tax at 30% which will absorb \$5,180/- and leave a balance of \$14,803.43 on Profit & Loss Appropriation Account.

I quite expected and hoped that by this time I should have something more definite and more encouraging to say: as it is that confounded "Arbitration" demanded by the ex-sublessees is still hanging over our heads, failing to agree to a nomination the opposition called upon the Court

to do so and such was done but nothing happened for months, finally under pressure from the Company's solicitors a date was agreed upon during last month and we were all set until informed that the appointed Arbitrator was in hospital and that is the last we have heard of it.

Again I have to report no revenue from the Company's Lot No. 29651 known as "Lower Flats" or that part of Lot 24766 known as Sungei Menelai Catchment "Hill Area".

As I said last year the Company had given a sublease to Towkay Foong Seong who was in a position to work the "Lower Flats" and willing to do so by gravel pumping; on account of the situation it is quite a large undertaking calling for a deviation of Sungei Johan over a distance of nearly half a mile the plans for which have been approved after prolonged reference to the Authorities, in order to clear the course for the river a large mound of earth and stones dumped from another area needs removal to a place where it will no longer occupy valuable ground and the mine proper to commence at the lower end of the deviation and working upwards sooner or later call for dumping area half a mile or more away.

So far as the Towkay has installed a 120 H.P. engine and a pressure pump near the mound intending to use a nozzle on it: an 8" gravel pumping installation will be required at the lower end for the actual mining; by the time the mine reaches the site of the mound or earlier special preparations for mining will be called for judging by the Company's Bore No. 32 of 1940 which went to a depth of nearly 100 feet for an average of 7.36 katties per cubic yard of tin-ore in a complicated geological formation which may possibly be described as an almost vertical "pipe" in the limestone with a mixture of schist and possibly granitic intrusive material.

As to the Menelai area, prospecting by Mr. Wong Fook Heng, who hopes for a sublease of the area, shows the area to be much deeper and richer in parts than was disclosed by the Company's investigation of more than 20 years past; meanwhile a moderate water supply has become available owing to cessation of mining in the

valley but the difficulty as to dumping remains to be overcome.

The sublessees' Khong Heng Kongsi at Kacha averaged about 100 piculs of ore monthly the mine suffers from the deterrent effects of depth, distance from the dumping area, high level of the dump, muddy returned water on account of no proper water supply having been provided, large open catchment area, and cramped position between the hillside and the abandoned Railway Reserve all tending towards low production and high costs.

At present the mining plan comprises:-

No.1 Sump: 1 - 8" vertical gravel pump driven by 150 H.P. electric motor and served by a 3/8 c.yd. excavator of digger type and 3 nozzles under natural head from ground level; the pump delivers to No. Sump gravel at about 25 feet (deepening) and also serves to throw flood water to ground level at about 110 feet.

No.2 Sump: 1 - 4 cyl. x 240 H.P.I.C. engine and 8" gravel pump delivering to No. 1 palong at about 125 feet.

No.3 Sump: 1 - 150 H.P. engine and 8" gravel pump lifting to about 70 feet and discharging on to dumping area.

The bottom of the mine is coming down to a point and difficultids are likely to increase unless the mine be allowed to slope into the Railway Reserve in which unfortunately the Kinta Water Main remains.

Towkay Lim Seng Fook's Chee Seng Kongsi has struggled bravely with the touch low grade ground at S.Pinjji, Tambun, producing 264.76 piculs of ore during the year under review; the area in the vicinity remains unsettled and the future of mining there is indefinite.

The Company has heard no more about the application for State Land which I mentioned last year and has done no prospecting during the year under review."

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT: The Chairman Addressed the Meeting as follows:-

"Gentlemen:

I regret that it is now two years since I last had the pleasure of addressing you at length. As a matter of fact I still suffer from the effects of Internment and during the past two years have been "seriously ill" so the doctor said when I asked him to pacify the Income Tax Authorities, actually there was nothing to report at that time.

Now to proceed - You have for the prescribed period had the 30

Directors' Report which was circulated with the Accounts; with your permission I will take them as read; should any question arise concerning the Accounts I will endeavour to reply later.

The Accounts for the past year show a profit of \$543.70 which means that you Directors are unable to recommend payment of a dividend.

You Directors are unable to reach a decision as to payment of an interim dividend for the current year pending the final result of the Company's Appeals with regard to the Award of the Arbitrator being received.

That "confounded Arbitration" as referred to in my address for 1952 is now more confounding than ever, after all these years we do not know how we stand and we suffer accordingly.

For reasons best known to our legal adviser I, although Founder, Chairman, Attorney and General Manager from the beginning and now largest shareholder and available at all times was not called during the Arbitration or during the Appeals, some of the evidence for the Sublessees was wrong and no one with the necessary knowledge was present to refute it, so it went down with the Arbitrator and greatly influenced his award against the Company, although he had his doubts about it; the evidence which concerned Lot 29651 now worked by Foong Seong was to the effect that the Sublessees were or would be able to work the area whereas all parties at a Meeting held on the 5th August 1948 unanimously agreed that they could not do so and quite rightly so, the area was to be sublet to Foong Seong but the Sublessees did not carry out the arrangement as to the Company 7% and they 8% of Foong Seong's 15% tribute.

The Arbitrator's Award was said to be had in law by Eminent London Counsel and following Originating Motion No. 8 of 1953 and No. 8 of 1954 part of the Award was set aside.

The Arbitrator was told that the Sublessees had dumping area in Lots 30286 and 29650 which was and is not so as that area was officially declared and has always been used for 10 dumping by Khong Heeng Kongsi, is now so used and is necessary for the working of the mine; evidently the Company's representatives and the Arbitrator were unaware of these facts.

Civil Appeal No. 29 of 1954 fixed for the 31st August 1954 and postponed to the 18th October 1954 when the Company was represented by Sir Roland Braddell and Mr.B.K.Das was heard in the Supreme Court by three Judges - and that is how we now stand, still in the dark at 30th September 1954 with \$33,634.63 in the bank account 1954 and further tribute to draw from Khong Heng Kongsi which has to date been refused amounting to \$32,347.85.

As you see your Directors' policy is giving a sublease to Towkay Foong Seong directly in opposition to the dog in the manger policy of our then Sublessees has given excellent results although we must regret that Foong Seong was not allowed to open up in 1947 when he offered to instal an 8" gravel pump in one month so we missed the \$800/= a picul days - the price of tin ore is now about \$220/= per picul.

At present S. Johan is hampering the mine but the deviation of the river is nearly completed.

As to Lot 24766 known as

"S. Menelai Catchment Hill Area", Mr. Wong Fook Heng's scheme came to nothing so a sublease was withheld and remains dependent upon the final results of the Appeal.

Khong Heng Mine has been working under considerable difficulty as to water supply and dumping area and is cramped by the abandoned Railway Reserve into which sloping has not been permitted, the mine produced about 125 piculs monthly but costs are high and mounting up; Note: For "Ulu Kinta" in Directors' Report read Mukim of Blanja.

Khong Heng Mine reached a depth of about 100 feet exposing the rich schistose lead but went down to a point and had to cease in depth.

A 130 H.P. electric motor pressure pump now feeds two nozzles and two low presrue nozzles are fed by gravity all on the western face now about 50 feet high with production somewhat below normal.

A 130 H.P. motor drives an 8" gravel pump lifting from about 50 feet below the surface to Palong No.1, thence an I.C. engine of 190 H.P. lifts to Palong No.2, thence a back plant consisting of a 100 H.P. motor and 7" pump picks up the tailings and deposits through a pipe line on to Lots 30286 and 29650 areas which the Arbitrator was led to believe were available for dumping from Foong Seong's area Lot 29651; no proper survey of the plant is available but the total lifts must be about 200 feet.

A 3/8 c.yd. excavator is now cutting a channel for return water from the dump after sloping and benching at the Railway Reserve area.

Foong Seong - Mine No.2: After clearing away the mound of tailings to make way for a deviation of S. Johan a delay of some months occurred pending approval of the plans; since that time work on the deviation has continued and the banks of the channel are now being turfed in order to prevent erosion; masonry will be commenced after this rainy season.

The mine is in rough previously worked ground consisting of broken schist and limestone above limestone bedrock which is showing up with small patches of virgin karang at a depth of about 50 feet.

In the mine are an 8" and a 10" gravel pumps of the very efficient vertical drive type (no suction pipe) driven by 120 and 200 h.p. electric motors; the 120 H.P. I.C. engine after clearing away the mound now feeds 2" and 1½" nozzles in the mine while a 150 H.P. motor feeds 2" and 14" nozzles.

In the bottom are 8" and 10" gravel pumps driven by 120 and 150 H.P. motors, the 8" pump is first lift to a second 8" pump which feeds a remarkable installation of jigs, tables and other forms of ore dressing machinery which appears to very efficiently trap the finest ore and a 7" back plant elevates tailings to the dump.





The former subleases expired on 31st December 1950, and even if the 1931 agreement did provide for such renewal, which is not the case, we have always disputed her right and her claim, if any, is barred by limitation.
- Since the beginning of 1951 there has been a good deal of litigation relating to the proper construction of the 1931 agreement and the rights of Madam Tong Swee King and Mr. Chan Phooi Hoong thereunder. The dispute was referred to arbitration, and, after a lengthy hearing lasting 8 days, the arbitrator made his award on 30th March, 1953, holding that we are obliged to renew the subleases of the lands held under Mining Leases Nos: 8899, 10217, 11543 and 11544. An application to set aside this award was made to the High Court at Ipoh. By his judgment dated 9th April, 1954, the Judge refused to set aside the award but remitted it to the arbitrator for his decision on 2 points. further appeal was taken to the Court of Appeal which,

by its judgment dated 12th April, 1955, wholly set aside the award. An application by Mr. Chan Phooi Hoong and Madam Tong Swee King for leave to appeal to the Privy Council was dismissed.

- 4. After all this prolonged litigation which involved all the parties in heavy costs, Mr. Chan Phooi Hoong accepted a sublease of Mining Leases Nos: 3899 and 11543 only, a sub-lease which we had all along offered to him. Madam Tong Swee King obtained a sub-sublease from Mr. Chan Phooi Hoong on terms arranged between them and not in accordance with the 1931 agreement on which she apparently placed a lot of reliance again.
- 5. We understood from Madam Tong Swee King's representative that she is willing to transfer to us at cost such lands in the vicinity as may hereafter be alienated to her. This is what is provided for in clause 4 of the draft agreement. What, we gathered, she objects to is the provision in clause 5 of the draft reserving to Mr. Chan Phooi Hoong the option to take a sublease of such new lands. It is perhaps her intention that Mr. Chan Phooi Hoong should have nothing to do with such new lands. We cannot agree to this as it may involve us in another litigation with Mr. Chan Phooi Hoong which we are anxious to avoid.
- 6. We have given a letter to Madam Tong Swee King permitting her to dump on the lands covered by Mining Leases Nos. 9946, 11646 and 11647. This authority expires on 20th July, 1957.
- 7. We are writing this letter to you as it is likely that Madam Tong Swee King will apply to you for a dumping order. We are placing these facts before you for your consideration should such an application be made. Our representative will be only too willing to call at your office to discuss this matter should you so desire.
