Railway Reserve & Kinta Water Supply Pipe Line, Papan.

The Pegang Prospecting Co. Ltd: have applied for a Mining Lease over the Railway Reserve adjacent to their land and shewn in red on attached plan in duplicate. Enquiries elicited the information that the application had been recommended for approval subject to revocation of the reserve and deviation of the pipe line.

- 2. The mine cannot resume operations until a mining title for the reserve is issued and the pipe line deviated. The matter is therefore of urgency to the Company who have been inactive for a long period and wish to resume operations at the earliest possible date.
- 3. The deviation of the pipe line as shown in plan has been discussed with, and provisionally approved by the Executive Engineer, Kinta, The method of deviation has not been finalised and we suggest the following course for consideration and approval.
- (a) The approximate length of the existing pipe line is 3430 feet, and the length of the proposed deviation approximately 4480 feet, an increase in length of 1050 feet.
- (b) To obviate the supply of costly cast iron piping, it is proposed that 3430 feet of 14" diameter mild steel slip joint pipe be laid on the line of the deviation to accommodate temporarily the water supply. The existing cast iron pipe line can then be lifted and laid with an addition of 1050 feet of new pipe. On completion of this line the water to be switched into it and the temporary

mild steel pipe lifted.

(c) It is doubtful if cast iron pipes can be acquired and we would enquire whether the 1050 feet additional length required for the deviation may be supplied by the Government.

As such pipes will remain Government property and are of no use for mining purposes, we would ask that the cost of supplying such pipes be for Government account.

- (d) With the exception of supplying approximately 1050 feet of cast iron pipe the cost of the deviation including the supply of the mild steel pipe and all materials required will be for clients account.
- (e) Clients are prepared to undertake the work of deviating the pipe line, under supervision or to the satisfaction of the Public Works Department, or such part of the work as may be considered appropriate by Government.
- 5. Early consideration of the above will be of great assistance to the Company and much appreciated.







During the past two years it has been known that the monthly recovered of tin ore has been such, that the mine has been operated at considerable loss, in our opinion, for the following reasons,

- (a) that the area of land comprising the sublease has now been exhausted.
- (b) the area of land comprising a section of the old railway reserve, that you have applied for, has not been sub-leased to you, by Messrs. Pegang Mining Co.Ltd.

The Mining installations at Khong Heng Kongsi to date are as follows, 1 No. 8" x 6" Water Pump 75 H.P. Electrically driven, 1 No. 7" Dia Gravel Pump 100 H.P. Electrically driven, 3 Nos. 12'-0" x 4'-0" jigs 10 H.P. Electrically driven, 2 Nos. Cyclones, and during mining operations an

average of 15 labourers have been employed on the mine in various capacities.

Prior to mining operations being carried out on the higher ground to the north east of the lot No. 21952 check prospecting was carried out by means of pitting and from the results, although considered marginal, mining operations were carried out, as all the low lands have previously been mined, but actual production on the high ground proved that recoveries of tin was the wrong side of the margin.

It is considered every effort has been made by your goodselves to instal mining equipment and work the land in a workmanlike manner, to recover maximum tin but the little tin recovered was a surface deposit 0' to 8'-0" in depth.

Enclosed is a certified true copy of the tin sales, that, over a period of six months has only totalled piculs 43.17, hence it may be seen that the mining operations have been most uneconomical.

The conditions under the sub-lease call for a labour force, or labour saving apparatus, equalling 79 labourers the miner has a total of 200 H.P. and 15 labourers to operate the present mine and conforms with the sub-lease conditions.

To conclude this report it is considered that unless the mining land within the railway reserve is subleased to the miner, mining operations must be terminated, as there are no more areas to work and further financial losses will be made.

the pipe line which however has not been carried out.

When I last addressed you I held out hopes, almost promises of dividends, as a matter of fact I expected fat ones while none has eventuated.

Our hopes and expectations were based on estimates and a lay-out carefully prepared by Towkay Ho Kok Yew, late General Managing of Khong Heng Kongsi and a director of the Company associated with the speaker as Attorney and General Manager of the Company; before us we had plans, boring records and knowledge of all that had been done during the past twenty years, we knew of diffi-culties to be surmounted and how to overcome them; we met the Mines Officer on the spot in 1946, explained everything at length and understood that our scheme for opening No.5 Mine in which no dumping had occurred, was approved; as I said last year, sales of ore from No.5 between the 1st of October and the 22nd November 1941 amounted to 339.81 piculs and fairly large stocks were said to have been lost on account of the occupation; the ore sold during that short period would now be worth some \$59,500/- but our conservative estimate of production as laid before Government and the Loan Board was as follows:-

We stated in the application to the Loan Board that subject to acquisition of the Railway Reserve and when fully equipped, the mine should produce 200 piculs monthly; but sad to relate:- Towkay Ho Kok Yew's successor entirely abandoned our scheme for re-opening No.5 Mine and, entirely without the Company's knowledge installed the 100 H.P. electric motor and pump which I mentioned last year in No. 2 Mine which had been summarily shut down by the Warden of Mines on the 11th December, 1933, as it was endangering the Railway and the pipe line, since that time No. 2 had been pretty well filled with tailings from No.5 and other mines; much of the material from No.5 consisted of ferrous stones from prior working which, under the 1946 scheme we intended to use as a barrier between No. 5 and No.2 to be

gradually reduced while taking No. 2 in hand so as to avoid dropping the heavy material as much as possible in depth while extending into No.2 and so as to avoid covering the valuable deposits of ore which go down to 165 feet or more.

The plant at Khong Heng Mine now consists of an 8" gravel pump in the bottom of No.2 Mine under approx. 60-70 feet head feeding a palong and a 5" electrically driven pump acting as a back plant on account of stacking and packing of heavy tailings, also a pressure pump serving 2 or 3 nozzles, in the Kongsi house there is a new navvy type I.C. driven excavator the purpose of which is unknown to me but it would have been very useful under the 1946 scheme in many ways.

After some 13 months spent on extracting most of the tailings from the wextern end of No.2 and reaching the 1933 bottom production from the 8" plant began with 24.69 piculs sold for \$4,567.27 in October and 17.58 piculs sold for \$3,311.59 in November, shocking results which were only to be expected as the remaining deposits lie deep and the mine had been pretty well cleaned up when shut down by the Mines Department.

When I visited Khong Heng Mine on the 29th of last month I found that the mine had been extended into the upper level of No. 5 and I have little hope of better results from No.5 as the lay-out is unsuitable.

Owing to the distance of No.5 Mine from the 8" pumping sump in No.2 the gradient in the bottom is poor so that the heavy tailings from No.5 which are now being dropped from the eastern face of No. 2 are packing and calling for continual blowing down and consequent reduction in cutting ore recovery and general efficiency; the open area is excessive from the point of view of catchment; the double lift as now laid out is excessive and I doubt that the 8" main plant would bear the load if lowered say some 30-40 fect in order to pick up values from the bottom of No. 2 and the upper levels of No.5 Mine; the 5" back plant is inadeuate for handling material from the main pumping plant should the latter be worked full bore.

Last year I mentioned 18 acres of good ground

known as "Lower Flats" (Papan) from which good returns were expected for some years to come, I regret to say that although the Company was definitely informed that arrangements had been made for the working of the area by Towkay Foong Seong who was mining successfully on the boundary, negotiations were broken off by Ho Kok Yew's Estate and Khong Heng Kongsi for reasons unknown to the Company; so we have all had to suffer; all the Company has been able to do is to apply for renewal of the Lease which is due to expire at the end of next year.

The dismal story which I have related is, to my mind, the one way I have of explaining how and, I maintain WHY, our hopes for last year have not matured.

No new finds have been made by our tributors' shafting in the Papan drill areas of which the principal part comes under Mining Lease No.10217, Lot No.24766; dumping and water difficulties remain with us, as I said last year other mines got ahead of us, the principal reason being that our Sublessees had held the area for 22 years and done nothing with it.

During October 1948 the area was divided into Sungei Menelai area of about 66 acres and Sungei Kacha area of about 31 acres, the latter being for the purposes of Khong Heng Mine while the Menelai area was sublet for one year to Mr. Thong Yee Kooi who is still engaged in trying to obtain water and dumping area so that he can work the land, the Sublease covers a mine opened by an experienced tin miner named Lee Fook who installed a pumping pl plant during July 1949; he sold 129.01 piculs during the year since which he has produced 51.64 piculs of high class ore; the Company intends to renew Mr. Thong Yee Kooi's Sublease and wishes him success and mutual benefit.

Lastly we come to our Tambun areas which are known as Bukit Tambun Tenggah; here the Company 40 and Ho Kok Yew's Estate hold a half interest each; the area was prospected and taken up as a low grade and tough dredding proposition for which there should have been a market had not many unexpected drawbacks come to pass, so a sublease was granted to Towkay Lim Seng Fook for whom Chee Seong Kongsi

produced 323.91 piculs of ore during the year under review; latterly he seems to have struck a particularly bad patch, but the Company is now prospecting a small adjoining area of State land which it is hoped will be alienated to the Company and the Estate of Ho Kok Yew and produce somewhat better The Sublessee, as stated last year, intended General Meeting to open another mine in the area should circumstances permit but circumstances have not permitted.

I do not intend to say much about the Accounts; they make me sick, there's that item "Income Tax" again while you have had no income from the Company for some ten years or more and your Directors no more than \$400/- to cover period 1941-1946 divided among three; you may note that we have kept our general expenses as low as possible and I may add that the item \$900/- constituting my salary as Attorney & General Manager is passed on by me to Kepala Foo Kim Swee who was appointed by the Company and Towkay Ho Kok Yew to supervise our interests, ore sales etc. on the 20th December 1946; I admit that I have not been getting about much lately, the vicinities of Papan and Tambun have been very unhealthy for the last year or so, I hear that a bandit was shot and killed, hand grenade captured etc. at my Tampoi Reservoir at Papan two days ago."

No questions were asked, and on the proposal of the Chairman, seconded by Mr. Greenwood, it was resolved that the Report and Accounts for the year ended 31st December 1949 be received and adopted.

DIRECTORATE: Mr. Cumming was re-elected a Director on the proposal of Mr. Duddell, seconded by Mr. Greenwood.

"Gentlemen: Before proceeding with my report I wish to record the death of Mr.G.G.Duddell who has been for many years a Director. His passing was a great shock to us all and his absence will be keenly felt by the Company.

The Accounts for the Company for the year ended 30th September 1950 show a profit of \$20,379.75 after reserving \$2,926.42 for Income Tax and your Directors recommend the payment of a dividend of 15% less Income Tax which will absorb the sum of 88,880/- leaving a balance of 11,499.75to be carried forward. Although the position is considerably better than last year, it cannot be considered to be by any means satisfactory.

When I addressed the Annual General Meeting in December 1949, I pointed out the difficulties the Directors were experiencing in trying to reach agreement for the mining of the area known as Lower Flats (Papan).

I regret to say that it has not been possible

even at this date to make arrangements for the working of this area by Towkay Foong Seong who is in an excellent position so to do as at present he is working a flourishing mine in the area adjoining. There has been considerable correspondence on this matter and from time to time the Directors have felt assured that the matter had come to a head. Such however has not been the case and your Directors are still pursuing the question.

With regard to the mine as now worked by Kong Heng Kongsi, the present lay-out does not make for its effective development being entirely dependent upon a deviation of the Kinta Water Main failing which the Company cannot obtain a mining lease for the Railway Reserve. I regret to say that although a plan for the removal of the main has long been approved the sublessees have taken no action in the matter.

The 1946 mining scheme provided for quick returns and possibly funds for the removal of the main with minimum expenditure for a mining plant and running costs which are now excessive; production during the year under review emanated from deposits covered by the 1946 scheme and the trouble is that the present lay-out cannot provide for working the deeper deposits, so that the average monthly output over the past year of approximately 100 piculs is unlikely to continue unless the lay-out revert to the original scheme or set to work another gravel pump in the deeper deposits which are now unobtainable."

On the proposal of the Chairman, seconded by Mr.Greenwood, it was resolved that the Report and Accounts for the year ended 30th September 1950 be adopted.

Chairman's Address to be presented at the Annual General Meeting to be held on Thursday, 10th December, 1959.

I regret to say that this year is not so good but we remain more fortunate than many another. Notwithstanding the higher price of tin, profits are down from \$85,377 to \$58,897 - to be further curtailed by income tax at 40%. A final dividend of 30 cents per share is recommended which would leave a balance of \$29,515 to be carried forward to next year's account.

Foong Seong's Mine had a stock of 475 piculs of ore at the end of September which is more than a start for the new quota period for which the quota is 470 piculs to the end of 1959. I am sorry to say that this property is unlikely to last. The other mines have little or no stock.

Total ore sales for the year amounted to 3,046 piculs which compares with 4,898 last year. Due to stoppages, a small amount of quota was sold.

FOONG SEONG MINES LID. - LOT 29651, MUKIM OF SUNGEL TRAP, KINTA:

The values hold good but the small remaining area is close to the main road and the Sungei Johan and, consequently, the Mines Department has demarcated a 100 ft. reserve. The mine has continued with much the same plant and has extended into adjoining land while working about half the time in the Company's land.

Our trouble is that the mine is so narrowed by the reserve that it comes in to a point under which lie the richest deposits of the whole Lot at a depth of more than 100 ft. - our "Star Bore", now rendered unworkable as the Reserve plus the sloping would amount to more than 250 feet.

The mine will have to close down about the middle of November. After the stoppage we cannot expect much apart from gleanings as the mine has very little bottom to clean up.

LEOW YAN SIP MINE - LOT 24766, MUKIM OF BLANJA, KINTA:

This mine has been having a bad time. Values in the deep mine fell off and the ground toughened considerably. The use of the expensive pumping plant has been abandoned and two nozzles are now sluicing low grade ground up the hillside. Production fell to 1,318 piculs which compares with 1,847 piculs last year.

Applications for abandoned State Land to the north remain under consideration.

KHONG HENG MINE - LOT 21952, MUKIM OF BLANJA, KINTA:

The working of this mine was retarded by tailings trouble and, latterly, shortage of water. Production amounted to 296 piculs against 830 piculs last year.

LIM SENG FOOK MINE - LOT 34588, MUKIM OF ULU KINTA:

Tough low grade ground compelled Nyan Foo Kongsi to close down in April, 1958. A new Kongsi known as Yoon Foo has prospected a new site and expects to commence production in December.

This is the last time that I shall address you as General Manager and Chairman of the Board of Directors as, after 30 odd years of it, I feel that the time has come for me to retire from the Board. I wish the Company a prosperous future and I thank my co-Directors, the Shareholders and Secretaries for the support and help that they have given me for so many years. Goodbye.

It was agreed that Mr. Chan Kim Phoy be employed as Mine Superintendent as from 1st June 1963 at a

monthly salary of \$250 plus 10% C.O.L.A.

The Chairman also informed the Meeting that he considered that the total staff to be employed at the Mine would be under 25 and that the cost of food for the staff would be in the region of \$30 per head per month.

It was agreed that the Company's Mining Consultants be requested to pay visits to the Mine in order to ensure that mining operations are being carried out in a satisfactory manner.

FINANCE: The representative of the Secretaries was instructed to make arrangements with Commercial Union Assurance Co.Ltd. for all necessary insurance cover including an accident policy for \$5,000 in respect of the Mine Superintendent.

RAILWAY RESERVE: The question of asking Government to pay interest on the sum of \$147,100/-, being the Company's share of the cost of the pipeline deviation,
