STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. On or about the 2nd day of September 1975 the Plaintiff was riding motor cycle No. SAL 3749 along Paya Lebar Way intending to turn right into Aljunied Road when he was run into and knocked down by motor car No. SM 1371D which was travelling along Paya Lebar Way towards Paya Lebar Road, Singapore.

2. The said collision was caused solely by the negligence of the Defendant.

PARTICULARS OF NEGLIGENCE

- (a) Failing to keep any or any proper lookout.
- (b) Driving at an excessive speed in the circumstances.
- (c) Failing to observe the presence of the Plaintiff on his motor cycle on the highway.
- (d) Driving into the Plaintiff.
- (e) Failing to conform to the traffic lights which were red against him
- (f) Failing to stop, swerve, slow down or otherwise avoid the said collision.

3. By reason of the aforesaid negligence the Plaintiff has suffered injuries has endured pain and has been put to loss and expense.

PARTICULARS OF PERSONAL INJURIES

- 1. Simple fracture of the shaft of the left femur.
- 2. Compound fractures of his left tibia and fibula. The compound wound measured 4 cm in length.
- 3. Fractures around his left ankle joint involving the medial malleolus and the shaft of the fibula.

The fracture of the shaft of the left femur was operated on. After reduction the fracture was fixed internally with an intramedullary Kuntascher nail. The fracture of the medial malleolus was reduced and fixed with a screw. The fracture of the fibula was reduced and fixed with a plate. He was re-admitted to the hospital on 6.7.77 and on the following day the Kuntscher nail, the screw and plate were removed from the left femur and left ankle. When seen on 9.9.77 the following were noted :-

He walks with a limp on the left side. He is able to manage stairs comfortably. He is unable to squat beyond 100° . He has 2.2 cm. of shortening of the left lower limb due to the fractures of his left tibia and left femur. The lower half of the left leg is curved medially and there is some prominence of the medial malleolus in the region of his ankle joint.

In the upper part of his left thigh, there is a scar measuring 12 cm x 14 cm due to pigmentation from the original abrasions. Similar areas of pigmentation measuring 14 cm x 13 cm are seen on the lateral side of his left leg. In the area of his buttock there is a 9 cm x 18 cm scar also associated with pigmentation. There are operative scars measuring 13 cm and 4 cm on the lateral aspect of his left thigh and left buttock. In the region of the ankle there are two operative scars measuring 7 cm and 14 cm on the medial and lateral aspects of his left ankle joint. Movements of his left hip are full except for about 25° loss of internal rotation and 10° loss of external rotation. Flexion of his left knee joint is also restricted by about 15°. At his left ankle joint, dorsiflexion of the ankle is restricted by about 15° and plantar flexion by about 10° . There is also some 20

wasting of his left thigh and leg muscles. The fractures of his left tibia and fibula have united with some degree of lateral angulation accounting for the shortening and the medial bowing of the tibia. It is likely that he will be troubled with early osteoarthritis in the region of his left ankle. The shortening of the left lower limb and the residual stiffness in his left ankle and knee are likely to be permanent. In the High Court No.2 Statement of

On 2.9.75 at 7 p.m. I was driving m/car SM 137D along Paya Lebar Way going towards Paya Lebar Rd. I was sending some of my workers home. Seated beside me was Soh Eng Tiang (identified). 30 There were three lanes on my side of the road. My car was travellingin the centre lane. I was doing 30 m.p.h. as I approached the junction. The lights were green as I approached the junction. There was no vehicle directly in front to me. There was a lorry stationary in the centre of the junction. It was waiting to make a right turn. A m/cycle came behind the lorry from its offside. It was intending to turn right. I could not stop in time. 40 Ι knocked into the m/cycle. I did apply my brakes but could not avoid the impact. The lorry made

a right turn and stopped at the side of the road. The driver had a quick look and then drove off. I did not notice number of the lorry but I told my workers to note the number of the lorry. Later I gave the number to the police.

GROUNDS OF JUDGMENT

The plaintiff's claim in this case was for damages for personal injuries and consequential loss suffered by him and caused by the negligence of the defendant on the 2nd day of September 1975 when the Plaintiff was knocked down by a car driven by the defendant at the junction of Paya Lebar Way and Aljunied Road, Singapore.

The plaintiff gave evidence on oath. He stated that on the 2nd September 1975 he was riding a motor-cycle along Paya Lebar Way and proceeding in the direction of Aljunied Road. At the junction of Aljunied Road with Paya Lebar Way he intended to turn right into Aljunied Road. When he reached the junction the traffic lights were green and he stopped a little beyond the stop-line and waited there for the traffic lights to show the green arrow which would permit him to turn right. When the traffic lights showed the green arrow he proceeded to turn right into Aljunied Road. As he was turning he saw a car coming from the opposite direction. He expected the car to stop because he had the right of way. The car failed to stop and collided into him. He was thrown off his machine and lost consciousness.

Under cross-examination it was put to the plaintiff that there was a lorry in front of him also waiting to turn right into Aljunied Road. The plaintiff stated that the lorry was behind him and that he was waiting slightly in front of it. It was suggested to him that in his hurry to cross the junction he shot out 10

from behind the lorry. The plaintiff denied this.

The defendant also gave evidence on oath. He stated that on the day and time in question he was driving his car along Paya Lebar Way and proceeding towards Paya Lebar Way. He was driving in the middle lane at about 30 m.p.h. when he approached the junction where the accident took place. He stated that the traffic lights were green as he approached the junction and that there was no vehicle in front of him but there was a lorry stationary in the kerb of the junction. The lorry was waiting to make a right turn. He claimed that the motor-cycle came from behind the lorry on its offside intending to turn right. He could not stop in time and collided into the motor-cycle.

Under cross-examination the defendant stated that he did not see the motor-cycle until it came into the junction from the offside of the lorry. He claimed that when the motor-cycle emerged he had already passed the stop-line and on seeing the motor-cycle he applied his brakes.

It was put to the defendant that the traffic lights having changed to amber, changed to red before he passed the stop-line and that he took a chance to rush through the junction even though the lights were red. The defendant denied this.

The sketch plan drawn by the police showed that the defendant's car left brake marks 14 metres long which amount to approximately 46 ft. If the length of the car which was approximately 15 ft. is added to the brake marks it makes a total distance of 61 ft. This means that the car travelled 61 ft. on seeing the motor-cycle before it could pull up.

I accepted the evidence of the plaintiff because in my opinion he was speaking the truth. In my opinion there was a failure on the part of the defendant to keep a proper lookout. Furthermore, the plaintiff had the right of way. The length of the brake marks also indicated that the defendant was travelling at speed and it was more probable than not that he tried to rush through the junction when the traffic lights were against him. In my opinion he was solely responsible for the accident and there was no evidence of negligence on the part of the plaintiff.



- The compound fractures of his left tibia and fibula were operated on the same day. After wound debridement, the fractures were reduced and treated in a plaster cast. On 11.9.75, the fracture of the shaft of the left femur was operated on. After reduction, the fracture was fixed internally with an intramedullary Kuntscher nail. The fractures around the left ankle joint were operated on 15.9.75. The fracture of the medial malleolus was reduced and fixed with a screw. The fracture of the fibula was reduced and fixed with a plate.

Post-operative convalescence was uneventful. The left lower limb was splinted in a plaster cast. He was discharged from the ward on 29.9.75 for further convalescence at home. He AB9-AB10 Letter, N.Balachandran 6th October 1977

was ambulant, non-weight bearing, with the aid of crutches.

In the follow-up clinic of this Department, he was seen on 14 occasions.

The plaster cast was removed on 16.11.75 and he commenced physiotherapy for his left knee and left ankle joints. He was certified fit for light duty as from 1.1.76 for a period of about 3 months.

He was re-admitted to the hospital on 6.7.77 10 and on the following day, the Kuntscher nail, the screw and plate were removed from the left femur and left ankle. He was discharged from the ward on 8.7.77 and after this operative procedure, he was temporarily incapacitated for about two weeks.

I saw him last on 9.9.77.

PRESENT COMPLAINTS

He complains of difficulty with squatting and pain in the region of his left buttock and left ankle. He finds it difficult to run.

CLINICAL AND RADIOLOGICAL FINDINGS

He walks with a limp on the left side. He is able to manage stairs comfortably. He is unable to squat beyond 100° .

He has 2.2. cm of shortening of the left lower limb due to the fractures of his left tibia and left femur. The lower half of the left leg is curved medially and there is some prominence of the medial malleolus in the region of his ankle joint.

In the upper part of his left thigh, there is a scar measuring 12 cm x 14 cm due to pigmentation from the original abrasions. Similar areas of pigmentation measuring 14 cm x 13 cm are seen on the lateral side of his left leg. In the area of his buttock, there is a 9 cm x 18 cm scar, also associated with pigmentation. There are operative scars measuring 13 cm and 4 cm on the lateral aspect of his left thigh and left In the region of his ankle, there are buttock. two operative scars measuring 7 cm and 14 cm on the medial and lateral aspects of his left ankle joint.

Movements of his left hip are full, except for

about 25° loss of internal rotation and 10° loss of external rotation. Flexion of his left knee joint is also restricted by about 15° . At his left ankle joint, dorsiflexion of the ankle is restricted by about 15° and plantar flexion by about 10° . There is some wasting of his left thigh and leg muscles.

X-rays show that the fracture of the shaft of the left femur has united in good position and there is no angulation. The fractures of his left tibia and fibula have united with some degree of lateral angulation accounting for the shortening and the medial bowing of the tibia. The fractures in the region of his left ankle joint have also united in good position. There is, however, some narrowing of the ankle mortis on the lateral side.

CONCLUSION

This patient sustained multiple injuries affecting the bones of his left lower limb. As a result of the fracture of the shaft of his left femur, he has a residual loss of rotation of the left hip. Due to the compound fractures of his left tibia and fibula, there is some degree of angulation and shortening of the There is also a little stiffness in left leg. his left ankle joint. Due to the fractures in the region of his left ankle, he has some degree of stiffness of the ankle joint with narrowing of the joint space. It is likely that he will be troubled with early osteoarthritis in the region of his left ankle. The shortening of the left lower limb and the residual stiffness in his left ankle and knee are likely to be permanent.

During 'A' phase the lights facing Aljunied Road both sides would show Green for a period of 35 seconds, after which the lights would turn to Amber for 3 seconds then to Red.

'C' phase then would show Green. These are the green arrows filter facing both sides of Aljunied Road for vehicles coming from the direction of Macpherson Road wanting to turn right into Jln Kolam Ayer and similarly for vehicles coming from the direction of Geylang Road wanting to turn right into Paya Lebar Way simultaneously. These green arrows would remain on for a period of 15 seconds, after which all the lights would show Red for 3 seconds.

'B' phase then would show Green. These are the sets of lights facing Jln Kolam Ayer and Paya Lebar Way respectively. These lights would turn on simultaneously for a period of 25 seconds, after which the lights would turn to Amber for 3 seconds then to Red.

'D' phase then would show Green. These are the green arrows filter facing Jln Kolam Ayer and Payer Lebar Way respectively for vehicles coming 40 from the direction of Jln Kolam Ayer wanting to turn right into Aljunied Road and similarly for vehicles coming from the direction of Paya Lebar Way wanting to turn right into Aljunied


Road simultaneously. These green arrows filter would remain on for a period of 10 seconds, after which all the lights would show Red for 3 seconds. 'A' phase then would show Green again.







Answer:

I am a Sales Supervisor working for m/s. Sunlight Interior Decorations at 93 B, Gay World.

I possess a qualified Singapore Driving Licence for class 3 numbered F 6283047. The licence was last renewed on 9.7.74 and it is due to expire on 30.6.77. (Produced and checked - found valid at the time of accident).

Motor car SM 1371 D is registered under my name. The insurance in respect of the said car is the Weller-Poley Underwriting Agencies Pte. Ltd. under Policy No. 4/MOO1/PC/0176 which covers from 20.5.75 till 27.11.75. (Produced and checked - found driver covered at the time of accident).

On 2.9.75 at about 1850 hrs., I was the driver of m/car SM 1371 D at the junction of Paya Lebar Way X Aljunied Road. I had four passengers in my car at the time of accident. Three of them who were seated at the rear did not witness the accident but the one who was seated on the front passenger's seat witnessed it. He is known to me as Soh Eng Tiang.

At the material time, all of us were going back home after work. I drove along the New Road leading to the junction of Aljunied Road and Paya Lebar Way. I was keeping to the centre lane at a speed of about 30 m.p.h.

The volume of traffic was then light. There was no vehicle in front of my car.

From far away, the traffic light at the junction was red i.e. against the traffic coming along the New Road leading to the junction. There was no vehicle stopping along the New Road at that time. When I came to a distance of about two car lengths from the junction, I noticed that the traffic had changed into green i.e. in favour of vehicles travelling along the New Road towards the junction. So I proceeded on. As I was nearing the stop line, I noticed only a lorry (XA 52 K) stationary at the junction from the opposite waiting to turn right. It was somewhere in the middle of the junction. When I was in the process of crossing the junction to get into Paya Lebar Way, suddenly a m/cycle (later noted as SAL 3749) appeared from the right hand side of the road and made a right turn into Aljunied Road. It was coming from my opposite direction. It was about 15 feet from the front of my car when it made a right turn. Although I applied brakes, it was too late and thus the front nearside portion of my car collided into the centre nearside portion of the machine. The m/cycle was thrown forward due to the impact. The m/cyclist was thrown as well. When my car came to a stop, I alighted from the car and gave assistance the m/cyclist. I found him injured on his leg. He was still conscious. I made him lie down on the road. I asked one of
