C A P. LXV.

An Act to explain "The Defence Act, 1860."

[29th June 1865.]

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to explain "The Defence Act, 1860:" Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

23 & 24 Vict. c. 112.

1. The Words "Barns, Hovels, and other like Structures of Wood" in the Thirty-fourth Section of the said Act shall be construed to mean only such Barns and Hovels as are constructed altogether of Wood, and are used for the Shelter of Cattle or Sheep, or for the Storage of agricultural Produce, or for some other like agricultural Purpose.

Interpretation of Words "Barns, Hovels," &c. in Sect. 34. of recited Act.

2. This Act may be read and construed as Part of the said recited Act.

Act and recited Act to be construed together.
