CAP. LXV.

An Act to explain "The Defence Act, 1860." [29th *June* 1865.]

HEREAS it is expedient to explain "The Defence Act, 23 & 24 Vict. 1860:" Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

1. The Words "Barns, Hovels, and other like Structures of Interpretation Wood" in the Thirty-fourth Section of the said Act shall be con"Barns,
strued to mean only such Barns and Hovels as are constructed in Sect. 34. of altogether of Wood, and are used for the Shelter of Cattle or Sheep, recited Act. or for the Storage of agricultural Produce, or for some other like agricultural Purpose.

2. This Act may be read and construed as Part of the said Act and recited recited Act.
