C A P. XCIV.

An Act to amend the Carriers Act. [5th July 1865.]

E it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

1. In the Carriers Act (that is to say, the Act of the Session The Term held in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth "Lace" in 11 G.4. & and the First Year of the Reign of King William the Fourth, 1 W. 4. c. 68. Chapter Sixty-eight, "for the more effectual Protection of Mail not to include " Contractors, Stage Coach Proprietors, and other Common Carriers Machine-" for Hire, against the Loss of or Injury to Parcels or Packages made Lace. " delivered to them for Conveyance or Custody, the Value and " Contents of which shall not be declared to them by the Owners " thereof,") the Term " Lace " shall, with respect to any Parcel or Package delivered after the Commencement of this Act, be construed as not including Machine-made Lace.

Carriers Act Amendment.

Commencement of Act. 2. This Act shall commence from and immediately after the Thirtieth Day of *September* One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

Short Title.

3. This Act may be cited as The Carriers Act Amendment Act, 1865.
