ROAD TRAFFIC

The A3 Trunk Road (Esher By-pass) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A3 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road and on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed on and near the road:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A3 Trunk Road (Esher By-pass) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 11th September 2010.

2. In this Order:

"the trunk road" means the A3 Trunk Road in the County of Surrey;

"the northbound carriageway" means the northbound carriageway of the trunk road between Esher Common Junction (A244) and the Greater London boundary (at Hook Rise Junction);

"the slip road" means the road leading to the northbound carriageway of the trunk road from the A244 at Esher Common Junction;

"works" mean drainage and structural investigation work on and near the trunk road; and

"a works period" means a period of 8½ hours starting at 2130 hours on Monday 13th September 2010 or on any subsequent day until 10th March 2012.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the northbound carriageway or the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
