## ROAD TRAFFIC

## The A20 Trunk Road (White Horse Hill Roundabout, Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - 31st August 2010

Coming into force - - 18th September 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A20 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on some of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed on and near the road:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A20 Trunk Road (White Horse Hill Roundabout, Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 18th September 2010.

## 2. In this Order:

"the trunk road" means the A20 Trunk Road near Folkestone in the County of Kent;

"a slip road" means -

- (i) the road leading from the coastbound carriageway of the trunk road to the A260 (White Horse Hill) at White Horse Hill roundabout, or
- (ii) the road leading to the coastbound carriageway of the trunk road from the A260 (White Horse Hill) at White Horse Hill roundabout;

"works" mean resurfacing work on and near the trunk road; and

- "a works period" means a period of 9 hours starting at 2000 hours on Monday 20th September 2010 or on any subsequent day until 17th March 2012.
- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -
  - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
  - (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
  - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or

(d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
