ROAD TRAFFIC

The M4 Motorway (Junctions 5 – 6, Westbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - 6th September 2010

Coming into force - - 25th September 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M4 Motorway and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that motorway and on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M4 Motorway (Junctions 5-6, Westbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 25th September 2010.

2. In this Order:

"the motorway" means the M4 Motorway in the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead and the Borough of Slough;

"the length of westbound carriageway" means the westbound carriageway of the motorway from the exit slip road at Junction 5 (A4 London Road) to the entry slip road at Junction 6 (A355 Tuns Lane);

"the slip road" means the road leading to the westbound carriageway of the motorway from the A4 (London Road) at Junction 5;

"works" mean essential carriageways repairs and all associated works on the motorway; and

- "a works period" means a period of 6½ hours starting at 2300 hours on Thursday 30th September 2010 or on any subsequent day until 24th March 2012.
- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the length of westbound carriageway or the slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -
 - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
 - (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
 - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or

(d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes
