ROAD TRAFFIC

The A259 Trunk Road (Winchelsea Road, Rye) (Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A259 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be restricted on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act $1984(\mathbf{a})$, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A259 Trunk Road (Winchelsea Road, Rye) (Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 9th October 2010.

2. In this Order:

"the trunk road" means the A259 Trunk Road at Rye in the County of East Sussex;

"the length of trunk road" means both carriageways of the trunk road between points 50 metres east of Wish Street roundabout (A268) and 200 metres south of its junction with Harbour Road;

"works" mean resurfacing work on the trunk road; and

"a works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 2000 hours on Monday 11th October 2010 or on any subsequent day until 8th April 2012.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the length of trunk road while traffic signs of a character authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating "convoy working" on that length of road are displayed.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to a vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire and rescue authority purposes.
