## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

## The A36 Trunk Road (Norton St Philip, Somerset) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A36 Trunk Road ("the A36"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road near Norton St Philip in the District of Mendip in the County of Somerset should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (**a**), hereby makes the following Order:

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Norton St Philip, Somerset) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 23 October 2010.

2. In this Order –

"the A36" means the A36 near Norton St Philip from its junction with the unclassified road that leads to Tellisford to its junction with the unclassified road that leads to Green Lane;

"the works" mean resurfacing works;

"a works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 25 October 2010 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to an article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period:

- (a) drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the A36;
- (b) drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the A36 whilst traffic signs of a character authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating "convoy working" on that road are displayed.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes; or
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.
