ROAD TRAFFIC

The M56 Motorway (Junction 14 Eastbound Entry Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made -	-	-	-	19 October 2010
Coming into	force	-	-	7 November 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M56 Motorway and slip roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those slip roads in Cheshire West and Chester should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the M56 Motorway (Junction 14 Eastbound Entry Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 7 November 2010.

2. In this Order;

"the motorway" means the M56 Motorway;

"works" means pedestrian crossing upgrade works on the slip road;

"the works period" means periods overnight between 2200 hours and 0500 hours starting on Monday 8 November 2010 and ending on Sunday 14 November 2010. However, work may start and continue between the same times on subsequent nights or continue overnight until completed, for such period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the work;

"the slip road" means the entry slip road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the motorway at Junction 14.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue or ambulance services, vehicles being used in connection with the works, or by traffic officers, or to any vehicle proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.
