ROAD TRAFFIC

The A5 Trunk Road (Mancetter Roundabout, Atherstone, Warwickshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - - 03 December 2010

Coming into force - - 10 December 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A5 Trunk Road ("the A5"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road at Mancetter near Atherstone in the County of Warwickshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A5 Trunk Road (Mancetter Roundabout, Atherstone, Warwickshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 10 December 2010.

2. In this Order:

"Mancetter Roundabout" means the circulatory carriageway of the A5 at its junction

with the B4116 Watling Street, the B4111 Harpers Lane

and Carlyon Road;

"the trunk road" means the eastern section of Mancetter Roundabout

between its junction with the eastbound carriageway leading from, and its junction with the westbound

carriageway leading to, Mancetter Roundabout;

"the works period" means the period starting at 2100 hours on Monday 13

December 2010 and ending when the said works have

been completed,

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the trunk road.

- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle-
 - (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes,
 - (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or
 - (iii) being used in connection with the said works.
